

Night Owl Coffee House

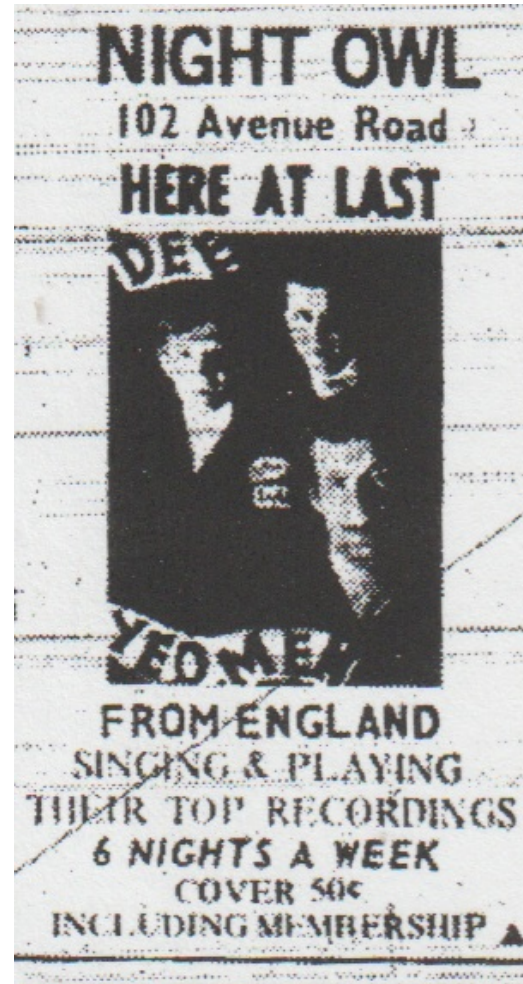
As we see below, from the Toronto Star's Gerry Barker; Harry Finegold and David Levin opened the Night Owl on March 6, 1964 at 102 Avenue Rd. Toronto. This would become one of the longer lived coffee houses; one that bridged in 1965, the move from folk/jazz to a Rock, R&B format.

From the Toronto Telegram June 10, 1965; a display ad for the Night Owl announcing the start of what would be one of the longest residencies we'd see in Yorkville Village in the 1960's, a group called Dee and the Yeomen.

The relationship between Finegold and the band; Graham (Dee) Dunnet (singer, guitar), Terry Watkinson (organ) and Len Lytwyn (drums) was "different", making Bruce Lawson's article in the Globe and Mail October 8, 1966, page 19, a must read (join the Toronto Public Library and access it online through their link to ProQuest Historical Newspapers).

Tely Apr 1st "After Four Chum About Town" in a trailer bottom of the page, providing detail on timing. The Jazz Couriers Fri 11-2 am. Saturday the Jazz Couriers with Eugene Amaro's quintet 9:30 to 4 am. Susan Coveart both nights. Also covered this weekend in the Tely's "What's Going On" column

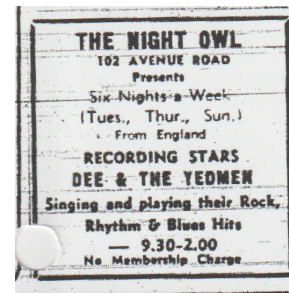
June, 1965

After a long break in advertising in the Telegram, the Night Owl changes its programming from jazz to R&B, Rock in early June.

The After Four classified don’t pick them up with regularity. From Bruce Lawson’s Globe article it’s evident why the club probably didn’t see it needed publicity in the daily newspapers.

Data Collection

These listings are a composite of what appeared in the Toronto Telegram's (the Tely) What's Going On listing in the Showcase Section and the Chum About Town listings in the After Four Sections Chum About Town and classifieds, augmented by electronic searches of the Toronto Star (Star) and Globe and Mail (G&M) archives from the 1960s on. Where I take words directly from a listing I use "quotation marks" and/or italics. Where I cite an article I reference the reporter if identified, as best I can.
